Continued from Page 1 week went well, and Yezaw was able to speak of Christ several times with Kyaw's family members. On the last day of his visit, Kyaw's grandfather asked Yezaw if there was any way that he could conduct a church service in the village.

Many years before, a missionary had visited this village and witnessed to Panna. The missionary's words convicted Panna's heart, and he had accepted Christ as his personal saviour. That was the only time anyone had spoken of Christ to Panna, until Yezaw had come to the village. For forty years Panna had been saved, but had never learned anything more about Christ nor had he ever attended a church service. Yezaw told Panna that he would do what he could.

A few weeks later, Yezaw spoke with Pastor Joshua, the pastor of the church, about having a church service for Panna. The pastor and several of the students traveled to the village to conduct a worship service there. The man was very happy and excited about the worship service. He invited his family to join in with the service. After the service Panna asked Pastor Joshua if he could return from time to time to preach the Word of God. Panna offered to let them use his house as a meeting place. The next day, Panna died and went to be with the Lord.

Pastor Joshua was not certain what would happen now that Panna had died. The preacher and the students returned to the village and continued to speak with Panna's family about the Lord. Soon Panna's daughter was saved. As Pastor Joshua and the students continued to go to the village, others became interested in the message about Jesus Christ and several accepted Christ.

The village was Buddhist, and the monks were very upset with what was happening. The first thing they did was refuse to let Pastor Joshua and the students use the main road leading to the village. This meant that they would have to use another road that led to a trail leading to the back of the village. Every Sunday Pastor Joshua and the students would travel by vehicle to the trail, and then walk the remaining five miles to the village.

When the monks saw that the Christians were going to continue witnessing, they told the villagers that anyone who was saved would have to move out of the village into the forest at the edge of the village. The new Christians left their homes and built new ones in the forest.

Another trial came when the members of a false religion heard about what was going on in the village. A group of them came to the village and spoke to the new converts. They tried to get them to believe in speaking in tongues and losing their salvation. These new Christians have faced more difficulties and challenges than most Christians experience in a lifetime, but they continue to be faithful. Several of them have been baptized and others are preparing for baptism. The monks have stopped their persecution for the time being, but they have not allowed the Christians to return to their homes in the village. They also will not allow Pastor Joshua and the students to use the main road.

Yezaw's health has continued to improve, and he graduated from the Bible Institute this year. He has surrendered to be the pastor for the people in this remote village. Another graduate of the institute is helping Yezaw with the work in the village, and people continue to get saved and learn more about Jesus Christ.
