"For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures;" I Corinthians 15:3

"But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed." Isaiah 53:5

Jesus payment for sins was not enough for the sins we did today. If one thinks he can lose his salvation then that implies that Jesus' payment on the cross was not sufficient payment. God's Word says:

"Who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed." I Peter 2:24

**A new heart.** God gives, along with salvation, a new heart that has new desires, purposes, and hopes.

"...And I will give them one heart, and I will put a new spirit within you; and I will take the stony heart out of their flesh, and will give them an heart of flesh: ..." Ezekiel 11:17-20

A new outlook; life is seen differently. When one is saved, educated from the Word of God, and obedient to it, life looks a lot different. Activities and actions of the past now may appear contrary to God's commands and harmful rather that "fun". The "old, dead" Bible now becomes alive and helpful.

"... I have shewed thee new things from this time, even hidden things, and thou didst not know them." Isaiah 46: 6

A new life (a new mind). Along with other new blessings comes the "mind of Christ" that thinks much differently than it did before the new birth.

"... And be renewed in the spirit of your mind; And that ye put on the new man, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness..." Eph. 4:22-27
