"Try a little harder," she answered with a soft light in her eyes.


"Yes, but when he is unreasonable and unkind you will be tempted to lose your temper, and answer him angrily. What will you do then?"

God's Word says about marriage:

♦ When a man leaves his father's and mother's home and marries a woman, they are no longer two people but one "person". That certainly should leave most of the "mine"s out of married people's conversations. In its place, there should me more "ours", because the two are bonded together. It was that way since the first marriage of the first man and woman.

"And Adam said, This is now bone of my bones, and flesh of my flesh: she shall be called Woman, because she was taken out of Man. Therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh." Genesis 2:23-24 Also: Mark 10:7-8

There was no "trying out" a marriage. If the sin of fornication had been committed, the man had the responsibility to make the woman his wife.

"And if a man entice a maid that is not betrothed, and lie with her, he shall surely endow her to be his wife." Exodus 22:16

"Who can find a virtuous woman? for her price is far above rubies." Proverb 31:10

A Christian should only marry a Christian.

"Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with darkness?" II Corinthians 6:14

Touching the opposite sex can lead to sin. To avoid that trespass, a man and woman should marry.

"Now concerning the things whereof ye wrote unto me: It is good for a man not to touch a woman. Nevertheless, to avoid fornication, let every man have his own wife, and let every woman have her own husband." I Cor. 7:1-2 Also: I Cor. 7:9

A husband and wife should show kindness to each other.

"Let the husband render unto the wife due benevolence: and likewise also the wife unto the husband." I Corinthians 7:3

A married person's life and

body are not their own, but their spouses. Most split-ups involve selfishness somewhere. Fewer divorces would occur if more mates would not worry about their own needs, but about meeting the needs of their partner. If both in the marriage would make this their purpose, all needs of both would be met, and happier, content marriages would be the result.

"The wife hath not power of her own body, but the husband: and likewise also the husband hath not power of his own body, but the wife. Defraud ye not one the other, except it be with consent for a time, that ye may give yourselves to fasting and prayer; and come together again, that Satan tempt you not for your incontinency." I Corinthians 7:4-5

♦ Although we are not under Old Testament law, the principle still applies that a husband and wife are still bound together until death separates them.

"Know ye not, brethren, (for I speak to them that know the law,) how that the law hath dominion over a man as long as he liveth? For the woman which hath an husband is bound by the law to her husband so long as he liveth; ..." Romans 7:1-4

Although God's commands are often disregarded and man's law often is obeyed more, God says marriage should be permanent.

"What therefore God hath joined together, let not man put asunder." Mark 10:9

"We can't argue and fight with each other," explained Barbara to her husband, "we're on the same side!"

The disagreement stopped!

Paul suggested that it would be better not to be married, if one were not already married., but not everyone is cut out for the single life-style. He also reminded the married that they must remain married.

"For I would that all men were even as I myself. But every man hath his proper gift of God, one after this manner, and another after that. I say therefore to the unmarried and widows, It is good for them if they abide even as I. And unto the married I command, yet not I, but the Lord, Let not the wife depart from her husband: ..." I Corinthians 7:7-16

Sadly, many marriages have failed. More would last a lifetime, if both men and women would put God first in their lives, and live the married life as God intended it to be.
