On a particularly rough airplane flight, a lady became very airsick. Her shoulders drooped, and her head slumped forward. She was totally wiped out.


The stewardess came by to help her. "Come, come now," she said, "buck up and get control of yourself. Sit up and take courage."

Continued from Page 1 and of righteousness, and of judgment: 9 Of sin, because they believe not on me;" John 16:8-9

- Reproves Christians of true righteousness (vss. 8, 10). He shows us that in the flesh we are certainly not righteous in God's eyes. It is the Comforter that helps us realize that only Jesus is without sin, and that we are worthy of Hell, unless we accept Christ's righteousness to cover our iniquity.
  - "Of righteousness, because I go to my Father, and ye see me no more;" John 16:10
- Shows man's heart that no one gets away with sinning against God, not even Satan (vs.8, 11).
  - "Of judgment, because the prince of this world is judged." John 16:11
- ◆ Shows and helps believers understand the Word of God (vs. 13). This is why it is so wrong for others to dumb down the Bible in an attempt to make it "easier to understand," in the new (mis) translations of God's Word. It is only the Comforter that helps anyone understand the Truth.

"Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak: and he will shew you things to come." John 16:13

- ◆ Tells us what the Father wants us to hear (vs. 13).
- Shows us things that will happen in the future (vs. 13).
- The Comforter is not to be glorified, but Jesus should be (vs. 14).

"He shall glorify me: for he shall receive of mine, and shall shew it unto you." John 16:14

This Comforter is still present and working in the hearts of men to this day. What has the Comforter shown you recently? Did you begin doing or stop doing of that which he convicted you?
