“And thou shalt love the LORD thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might.” Deut. 6:5

One of the main desires of God is that we love Him with all our being. Throughout the Bible, God tells us to love Him with all our heart because:

Loving God is a commandment and expectation of our Creator.

“But take diligent heed to do the commandment and the law, which Moses the servant of the LORD charged you, to love the LORD your God, and to walk in all his ways, and to keep his commandments, and to cleave unto him, and to serve him with all your heart and with all your soul.” Josuha 22:5 Also: Jos. 23:11.

“Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind.” Mt. 22:37 Also: Mark 12:30, Luke 10:27.

He is our strength, preserver, protector, and deliverer. Those are certainly reasons to love Him.

“I will love thee, O LORD, my strength.” Ps. 18:1 Also: Ps. 31:23, Ps. 97:10, Ps. 145:20.

He loves us, and He hears our pleas.

He is faithful and merciful to keep His promises.

“Know therefore that the LORD thy God, he is God, the faithful God, which keepeth covenant and mercy with them that love him and keep his commandments to a thousand generations;” Deut. 7:9

In Acts 3, it is found that the Holy Spirit used two disciples to perform a miracle. John and Peter told a lame man (Acts 3:2-8), who had been unable to walk since birth, to get up and walk — and the man did! Unused and weak legs were instantly transformed, and the man was healed. Not only was he able to walk, but his gratefulness could not be contained, and he leaped into the air and praised the Lord. That is why most miracles are performed, so that God will get the glory.

Soon, however, the word of the supernatural occurrence got around. According to what Peter said, the crowd gave the two men credit for the healing. Instantly Peter corrected their error, “... why look ye so earnestly on us, as though by our power or holiness we had made this man to walk”.

God is still in the miracle performing business. When God does the impossible, it is always He that should be honored, never a man. The person used to do God’s will is simply that, one that God used.

Unfortunately, the Healer and the Changer of the impossible often gets forgotten, and God seldom gets the glory for doing the incredible. People pray for an ailment or a bad situation to change. The preacher’s prayers are honored, and the man is sometimes revered as being responsible. Often little credit is given to God. The man, medicine, or objects are just the vehicles God uses. God is the only one that can change anything.

“He that walketh in his uprightness feareth the LORD: but he that is perverse in his ways despiseth him.” Proverbs 14:2

Proverbs 14:2 explains why a lot is happening in societies, politics, among our youth, in our public education system, and even in many churches. The verse exposes the motive behind so much irrational thinking and behaviors. It puts all the confusion, anger, rejection of centuries-old accepted beliefs, and desires for social changes in perspective. It gives an answer for what is happening around us. A growing population hates God, although they may not admit or realize it.

The root of much of the extreme hatred is not just because of other’s refusal to accept baby-butchered abortions, homosexuality, who they vote for, what political party they belong to, or even their adherence to old-fashioned morals and values. The defiance we are seeing is because people refuse to obey the Lord.

Their aversion may be taken out upon those with biblical standards and beliefs because their life-styles remind them of a God that requires them to live His way. Instead of obeying and being reminded of the convictions they have in their lives, they chose to remove all reminders of God’s demands. This defiance is nothing new. Rebellion against God has been around since early history.

Moses took the brunt of complaints when leading Israel through the wilderness. He knew that it was God Israel was angry at.

“And Moses said, This shall be, when the LORD shall give you in the evening flesh to eat, and in the morning bread to the full; for that the LORD heareth your murmurings which ye murmur against him: and what are we? your murmurings are not against us, but against the LORD.” Ex. 16:8

Samuel faced Israel's anger when the people wanted a king, instead of judges. God reminded His appointed man that it was God the masses were rejecting.

"And the LORD said unto Samuel, Hearken unto the voice of the people in all that they say unto thee: for they have not rejected thee, but they have rejected me, that I should not reign over them." 1 Sam. 8:7

When Jesus sent 70 soul-winners out to be witnesses to others, He warned the workers that if they were despised, it was because the people first hated God.

"... 16 He that heareth you heareth me; and he that despiseth you despiseth me; and he that despiseth me despiseth him that sent me." Luke 10:1-16
