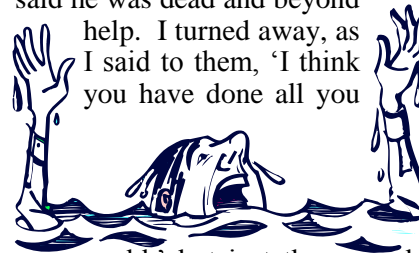

Divine Orders

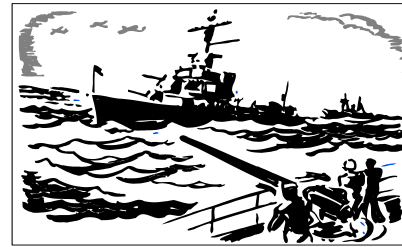
