For my good?


By faith we look beyond the storms

- When a believer misses preaching, many unsaved see he is missing. Those that miss church are being bad examples to the unsaved!
- Preaching can also be an encouragement. In a world that does not encourage godly behavior, the only place where Christians can be encouraged if they are living the way God desires, is through preaching.
