A new heart. God gives, along with salvation, a new heart that has new desires, purposes, and hopes.

“A new heart also will I give you, and a new spirit will I put within you: and I will take away the stony heart out of your flesh, and I will give you an heart of flesh.” Ezekiel 36:26 These verses were written about the people of Israel, but the principle can be applied to us. Also: Ex. 11:17-20

A new outlook; life is seen differently. When one is saved, educated from the Word of God, and obedient to it, life looks much different. Activities and actions of the past now may appear contrary to God’s commands and harmful rather than “fun”. The “old, dead” Bible now becomes alive and helpful. *“Thou hast heard, see all this; and will not ye declare it? I have shewed thee new things from this time, even hidden things, and thou didst not know them.”*

“For, behold, I create new heavens and a new earth: and the former shall not be remembered.” Isaiah 65:7

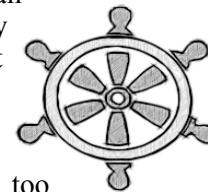
