This is the official 300th edition of the Bible View! My burden to leave some biblical teaching in as many homes as possible started while visiting a church bus route around



1988. While attending Memorial Baptist Church in Ocala, Florida, I noticed while inviting folks to church, that I was not leaving any biblical-education literature behind at each home. That is when I started a one page, weekly, unnamed, newsletter that had some biblical teaching to leave at each visited house.

After moving to Haines City, Florida three years later, I learned that Landmark Baptist Church was visiting close to 500 homes each week in their active bus ministry. My heart was burdened to leave biblical-based literature at the visited houses. Pastor Mickey Carter allowed me to produce the

publication, originally called The Landmark Baptist Bus Banner. It was then, and still is, distributed by those on visitation and given to those attending that church. Since many in the visited households did not attend church, it was an attempt to leave behind something that could teach them biblical doctrine.

Almost ten years ago a friend, Dr. Bob Ogden, suggested I make the publication available on the internet. That idea stayed with me, and five years ago, the publication was named The Bible View and was put on the web-site:

www.OpenThouMineEyes.com.

Each year more and more features are added to the site. There are now almost 300 free Bible Views available at the site, along with over 300 Bible-related articles, puzzles, a daily devotional, and Sunday School/sermon ideas.

Last month alone over 105,000 site hits came from over 112 different countries. Although, I am not aware of all using The Bible View, web statistics show at least 300 churches are using it every week, plus the almost 1,000 receiving the e-mail version and the many receiving the daily devotional. Some of the churches distributed as many as 750 Bible Views

copied from the single master they download from the site. The Bible View is still reaching many after 23 years.

In all these years, thousands have gotten some Bible teaching from this little publication. I want to thank my wife, Barbara, for proofing thousands of pages and for the many Christians that also have demonstrated their burden to get as much Bible teaching into as many houses as possible by distributing this paper to households, churches, hospitals, stores, and many other places. After all, how will others learn about the truths from the Word of God unless God's people attempt to tell them? Handing out The Bible View is one way to get biblical principles into houses we cannot always visit.
